



# **General Description**






Figure 1. On Region Characteristics




Figure 3. Normalized On Resistance vs Junction Temperature




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 9. Unclamped Inductive Switching Capability




Figure 11. Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs Case Temperature




Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage




Figure 10. Gate Leakage Cuurent vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 12. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 13. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation




Figure 14. Junction-to-Case Transient Thermal Response Curve





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
